Motion by Rogers, seconded by Zumbach to approve claims for AP checks #71006425 - #71006459 in the amt. of \$302,799.77, AP ACH in the amt. of \$530,147.95, and voids in the amt. of \$450.00.

Ray Stefani, Chairperson of the Compensation Board, presented the recommendation for Fiscal Year 2023 elected officials salaries in the amount of 8% for the Board of Supervisors, Auditor, Recorder and Treasurer and 11.56% for the Sheriff (because of the Back the Blue act passed by the Iowa Legislature).

The Board discussed a resolution setting the Fiscal Year 2023 elected officials salaries. Chairperson Rogers stated that anything over 3% (which is in the budget) would need to be absorbed within each elected official's 2023 budget.

Motion by Rogers, seconded by Walker to adopt Resolution 2022-3-41  
A Resolution Relating to Fiscal Year 2023 Elected Officials Salaries  
WHEREAS, the Linn County Compensation Board, in accordance with Iowa Code Sections 331.905 and 331.907, meets annually to review the compensation paid to the Linn County auditor, treasurer, recorder, sheriff, attorney, and supervisors, and comparable officers in other Iowa counties, other states, private enterprise, and the federal government; and,  
WHEREAS, upon completing its review, the Compensation Board prepares a recommended compensation schedule for the county's elected officers for the succeeding fiscal year to submit to the board of supervisors for inclusion in the county's budget; and,  
WHEREAS, the fiscal year 2022 compensation schedule for elective Linn County officers is: auditor, treasurer, recorder, and supervisors - \$119,197.97; sheriff - \$164,543.95; and attorney - \$190,492.28; and  
WHEREAS, the Linn County Compensation Board met on January 26, 2022, at which time it voted to recommend an 11.56% increase in the compensation paid to the sheriff and an 8.0% increase in the compensation paid to the auditor, treasurer, recorder, attorney, and supervisors for fiscal year 2023, which begins July 1, 2022.  
WHEREAS, the Linn County Compensation Board submitted its recommended fiscal year 2023 compensation schedule to the Linn County Board of Supervisors; and  
WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors, upon receipt and review of the recommended fiscal year 2023 compensation schedule, determined that it will reduce the increases recommended by the Linn County Compensation Board by 39.45% and set the percentage increase at 7.0% for compensation paid to the Linn County Sheriff and 4.84% for compensation paid to all other Linn County elected officers in fiscal year 2023.  
BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED by the Linn County Board of Supervisors that the final fiscal year 2023 compensation schedule for Linn County elected officers is as follows:

Auditor	\$5,769.18 increase or \$124,967.15 total salary
Treasurer	\$5,769.18 increase or \$124,967.15 total salary

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT AND IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, by the Linn County Board of Supervisors, this date met in lawful session, that the salary for all elected officers of Linn County, Iowa, be increased according to the amount previously stated for fiscal year 2022-2023, and effective July 1, 2022.

Discussion: Supervisor Zumbach stated that he understands the requirement of the Back the Blue Act, however, he believes that they are borrowing against next year's budget by approving any above what is in the budget, which is 3%. He believes that is not fiscally responsible. He cannot support anything above 3%.

Chairperson Rogers noted that elected officials will have to make up the difference within their budgets and if there are budget pressures, they would have to look at their operations, prioritizes and make recommendations to the Board. He also stated that they did freeze salaries last year in solidarity and as a shared sacrifice for members of the community. He hopes the public can see this as a reasonable salary accommodation.

Chairperson Rogers announced that Supervisor Walker's phone call was dropped at 11:18 a.m. and is no longer participating.

Motion by Rogers, seconded by Zumbach to open public hearing on proposed Fiscal Year 2023 budget.

Sara Bearrows, Budget Dir., presented the following FY 23 budget summary:

- Countywide levy rate reduced to \$5.85, down from \$6.24
- Rural residential rates remain at \$2.71
- Impact to homeowner: a decrease of 10.0% due to the elimination of the MHDS levy and a change in the state residential rollback
- Commercial & industrial property taxes decrease 6.3 %
- Farm taxes increase 1.3%
- Wages for non-bargaining unit 3%; 2.25% for AFSCME; 3% for PPME and IBEW
- Health & Dental insurance rates increase 6.5%

There were no oral or written objections.

Motion by Rogers, seconded by Zumbach to close public hearing.

Chairperson Rogers stated that he appreciates Supervisor Zumbach's comments previously on the salary and noted that the salaries that they approved for elected officials is a fraction of a percent of the budget and he hopes Supervisor Zumbach will support the overall budget.

Supervisor Zumbach stated that he will support the budget but this is a glaring example of why they are not CEO's. If he was a CEO and the county was his company, they would never have gotten this far because they are actually borrowing against next year. It is a small percentage, but every percent counts. Budget and Finance staff have made it very clear to him that with only two board members, it would create a lot of chaos if he did not vote to approve. He will not put the county in jeopardy, however, if there were three members, he would vote against it. He will support with some personal objections. He wanted to make it clear that next year's budgets are already going up because of the price of trucks for secondary roads and conservation as well as everything they do.

Bearrows clarified that the county is not taking out a loan.

Motion by Rogers, seconded by Zumbach to approve certification of Fiscal Year 2023 budget.
